

## SUBMISSION GUIDELINES

1. Articles may contain up to 50 thousand characters including spaces and reviews may contain up to 15 thousand characters. Articles must be accompanied by abstract with at least 100 words and up to 250 words, in Portuguese and in English, as well as up to 5 keywords in Portuguese and in English. If the article is written in a language other than Portuguese or English, the author must also include the abstract and keywords in the original language of the text.
2. The author must send the article or review by electronically means only, through the journal's webpage, in the A4 format, Arial 11, in a Word (.doc, .docx), Rich Text (.rtf) or compatible file.
3. The title must be in the original language, followed by its English title (if the original title is in English, it is followed by its Portuguese translation). Next is the the author's name, institution, city and country. The Portuguese abstract and keywords follow, then the English abstract and keywords, and finally the text itself.
4. Articles with quotations in the Greek language must either use Unicode or transliterations of the words in Greek, according to the *Novas Normas de Transliteração, Archai 12* (jan-

jun 2014), p. 193-4

5. Quotations and references must obey ABNT standards (NBR 6023 e NBR 10520). Page numbers in direct quotations are not omitted. See examples below. Please keep the number of footnotes to a strict minimum and make the notes brief.
6. Translations must be accompanied by the author's authorization.
7. Books in review must have been published up to one year before, if in Brazil, or up to two years before, if abroad.
8. If images are used, they must be in JPG or TIFF format, with resolution of 300 dpi, black and white, accompanied by caption as well as by its source.
9. The publication of originals will automatically imply forfeit of author's rights.

### Analysis

1. The review and selection of submissions are conducted by peers. The analysis of the article is documented in the archives of the Archai journal. Texts submitted are forwarded by the Editorial Committee to the Scientific Committee or to ad hoc readers. Texts are judged by their conformity to the journal's editorial line, to the editorial norms and by the quality of the writing, both in terms of originality and relevance of the proposed themes as well as in terms of the critical and/or informative impact that they may have to the advance of the studies about the origins of Western thought.

### Examples of citations (in accordance with the norm NBR 10520)

Citations in the Archai Journal follow the author-date system, as shown in the following examples:

#### Indirect citation

Irony would thus be an implicit form of shown heterogeneity, according to the classification proposed by Authier-Reiriz (1982).

#### Direct citation

"Despite appearances, the deconstruction of logocentrism is not a psychoanalysis of philosophy [...]" (DERRIDA, 1967, p. 293).

### Examples of most common end references (NBR 6023 adapted) Book (monograph in full)

The essential elements are: authors, edition, place, publisher and date of publication.

*GOMES, L. G. F. F. (1998). *Novela e sociedade no Brasil*. Niterói, EdUFF.*

#### Articles

The essential elements are: author(s), title of the part, article or report, title of the publication, place of publication, number of the volume, year or issue, number of the first and last page and, if article or report, the date or period of publication and particularities that identify the part (if applicable).

#### Congresses and other events

The essential elements are: the name of the event, number (if applicable), year and place (city) where the event took place, followed by the title of the document (proceedings, minutes, thematic topic,

etc) followed by the place of publication, publisher and date of publication.

#### **Theses, dissertations and other academic work**

When citing theses, dissertations and other academic work, it is necessary to indicate in footnote the type of document (thesis, dissertation, etc), the degree to which it was submitted, the institution, the place and date of the defense as stated on the approval page (if applicable)
